PAPER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ aseptic packaging (drink, milk, soups, food)</li> <li>✓ books (paperback, hardback, phone books)</li> <li>✓ boxes (food, snack, shoe, toys)</li> <li>✓ catalogs/magazines</li> <li>✓ gift wrap (non-shiny/non-foil only), kraft paper</li> <li>✓ junk mail</li> <li>✓ milk &amp; juice cartons</li> <li>✓ molded fiber containers</li> <li>✓ newspapers &amp; inserts</li> <li>✓ paper egg cartons</li> <li>✓ paper insulation (Climacell)</li> <li>✓ tubes from paper towels &amp; toilet paper</li> <li>✓ windowed envelopes NEW!</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✗ foil-type gift wrap (can't easily be torn)</li> <li>✗ food contaminated boxes such as greasy pizza boxes*</li> <li>✗ ice cream containers</li> <li>✗ laminated paper</li> <li>✗ paper plates, bowls, cups</li> <li>✗ paper that can't be torn easily (typically means there are plastic layers added)</li> <li>✗ paper towels, napkins, tissues</li> <li>✗ thermal paper receipts</li> <li>✗ wax paper</li> </ul>
PLASTIC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ #5 takeout containers</li> <li>✓ bottles (soap, dressings, drinks, sauces, etc.)</li> <li>✓ buckets (no metal components)</li> <li>✓ flower pots (CLEAN, no soil or plant material)</li> <li>✓ frozen food trays</li> <li>✓ jars (peanut butter, spreads, sauces)</li> <li>✓ jugs (detergents, milk, juices)</li> <li>✓ large items, such as playhouses, laundry baskets, &amp; lawn furniture</li> <li>✓ milk/soda crates</li> <li>✓ pet carriers</li> <li>✓ pump bottles (lotions &amp; soaps)</li> <li>✓ spray bottles (hair &amp; cleaning products)</li> <li>✓ storage bins</li> <li>✓ tubs (butter, cheese, yogurt)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✗ #1 plastic clamshell packaging (food, toys, electronics, batteries, etc.)</li> <li>✗ acrylic plastic</li> <li>✗ battery-operated electronics</li> <li>✗ bubble mailers</li> <li>✗ CDs/DVDs &amp; jewel cases</li> <li>✗ crinkly wrappers for chips &amp; snacks</li> <li>✗ cups, plates, straws &amp; utensils</li> <li>✗ drink &amp; food pouches</li> <li>✗ gel packs</li> <li>✗ hangers</li> <li>✗ insulation</li> <li>✗ liners from cereal/cracker boxes</li> <li>✗ motor oil or pesticide bottles</li> <li>✗ packing peanuts</li> <li>✗ plastic bags, film, wrap, &amp; plastic-bagged materials</li> <li>✗ plastic egg cartons</li> <li>✗ PVC plastics</li> <li>✗ Styrofoam™</li> <li>✗ toothpaste tubes, toothbrushes</li> </ul>
METAL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ aluminum, steel &amp; tin cans (even pet food!)</li> <li>✓ EMPTY aerosol cans</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✗ aluminum foil/bakeware*</li> <li>✗ compressed gas tanks (propane, helium, oxygen, etc.)*</li> <li>✗ hangers*</li> <li>✗ motor oil or other automotive fluid cans</li> <li>✗ pots, pans or other scrap metal*</li> </ul>
GLASS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ any color glass bottles &amp; jars</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✗ ceramics</li> <li>✗ CorningWare or Pyrex</li> <li>✗ lightbulbs</li> <li>✗ mirrors</li> <li>✗ non-food/drink glass (window panes, drinking glasses, furniture inserts)</li> </ul>
CARDBOARD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ clean, dry cardboard (no plastic bags, film or Styrofoam packaging)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✗ food contaminated boxes such as greasy pizza boxes* (these can be composted in the Feed The Green Bin program.)</li> <li>✗ furnace filters</li> <li>✗ Styrofoam™ pieces</li> <li>✗ waxed cardboard (bulk/supplier produce boxes)</li> </ul>
