PRESCRIPTION OPIOIDS

Prescription opioids can be used to treat moderate-to-severe pain and are often prescribed following surgery or injury, or for health conditions such as cancer.

HEROIN

Heroin is an opioid drug made from morphine, a natural substance taken from the seed pod of the poppy plants grown in Southeast and Southwest Asia, Mexico, and Colombia. Heroin can be a white or brown powder, or a black sticky substance known as black tar heroin.

FENTANYL

Pharmaceutical fentanyl is a synthetic opioid pain reliever, approved for treating severe pain. It is 50 to 100 times more potent than morphine. Fentanyl can be found in any street drug and greatly increases the risk of overdose.

ALCOHOL

Alcohol intoxication affects the brain, causing slurred speech, clumsiness, and delayed reflexes. Alcohol stimulates insulin production, which speeds up glucose metabolism and can result in low blood sugar, causing irritability and possibly death for diabetics.

COCAINE

Cocaine is a powerfully addictive stimulant drug made from the leaves of the coca plant native to South America. Adding synthetic opioids to cocaine is especially risky when people using cocaine don't realize it contains this dangerous additive.

METHAMPHETAMINE

Methamphetamine is another common drug one can overdose on and is a highly addictive stimulant that can quickly alter the brain giving users an intense high. Methamphetamine is often abused because as quickly as the high comes, it goes, leaving users needing more to avoid crashing.
