


First, some demographic destiny: Twice as many Older Adults in Howard County



SURVEY RESPONDENT DEMOGRAPHICS


Six in ten respondents are Boomers

We only surveyed adults ages 45+






7 in 10 respondents are female



Mean income is \$118,000 for respondents




Q27. Which of the following best represents your total annual household income? Please include all sources of income for your household. Remember, your responses are completely confidential and will not be linked to you personally in any way.

One in six refused to answer




Approximately three-quarters of respondents live in Columbia/Ellicott City







How Safe Do you Typically Feel...






Respondents rate their <u>own</u> quality of life fairly high

Those with higher incomes rate their quality of life very high



These ratings are not unusual

 In other studies we have conducted in other states, as well as nationally, we typically see adults rating the quality of life for older adults at lower levels than their own. <u>Even if they are</u> over 65 themselves.










Q50. Do you feel you need transportation more often than it is available to you for appointments, visiting, social events, etc.?


Respondents rate fitness and dining out as most <u>important</u>










Only one in three think <u>Howard County</u> is prepared for tomorrow's older adults





Half of the respondents believe they are financially prepared for retirement




Two-thirds judge their own health to be "excellent" or "very good"






Mental sharpness and maintaining vitality are top priorities

Caregiving and getting care are growing segments in Howard County




Women and younger generations (Boomers and younger) are more likely to provide care to others

Implications for 20 Year Master Plan for Older Adults

- The <u>perception</u> that "older adults" in general have a lower quality of life reflects the "problems of aging" mindset. It's time to change to the "promise of living longer lives."
- Focusing on increasing or improving services for older adults centered on transportation, social engagement, intergenerational engagement and education opportunities will strengthen ties to Howard County.
- With the strong desire to stay in their own homes, Howard County needs to develop broader range of housing options available to older adults, including "Granny Flats," co-housing and multi-party ownership.

COMMUNITY FOCUS GROUPS



PURPOSE

"I don't worry about 20 years from now."

"I think about it often. My home will need modifications."



Living in Howard County

- Housing is expensive; want more options for senior living, more affordable housing options.
- Don't want to live with children; prefer independent living.
- Interest in options like "Golden Girls," or cohousing.
- Could use help during "transitional" phases.

Getting Around in Howard County

- Most all drive, but already have made accommodations (not at night, with a "buddy.")
- Use Howard County transit options, but cannot rely on them. Cost a factor.
- Interested in community-based solutions.
 Want more transit options.
- "Transportation means control."



"I understand my limitations and I am slowing down. But that doesn't mean I've stopped living."



Activities in Howard County

- Most get out and engage socially, and understand the benefits.
- Rely on Senior Centers, but also go to library, church, Community College, community facilities and other places to see and do things.
- Prefer opportunities to engage with all ages, "keeps me young."



Growing Older in Howard County

- Concerned about being isolated; hope the county and community can address that.
- Worried whether the county is ready for more older adults.
- Generally not focused on the long-term, but the here and now.



Implications for 20 Year Master Plan for Older Adults

- Transportation and living in their home independently are top concerns.
- Strategies to maintain independence are key, but not many have clear plans yet.
- Many older adults have the mindset of "we'll cross that bridge when we get to it" when it comes to aging issues.
- Community supports need to be put in place before the wave of older Boomers hits – demand for services will come, but not until the last minute.



Preferred Future

- Improved synergy and communication among county-wide partners (public, private, and nonprofit).
- Serve as model for country in providing vulnerable residents with efficient and effective services.
- Co-located (physically or virtually), distributed network of services for older adults and their caregivers, accessible through a directory.

Preferred Future

- "Howard County Life Care," a multistakeholder system that fosters a healthy way of life across all domains (beyond health care).
- Wide range of housing options: high-density, highly connected, "universal design", mixeduse, and mixed-income.
- County residents plan for later years using financial planning and other relevant skills learned throughout their lives.

Howard County Aging Master Plan

EMERGING PRIORITIES

- Priority #1: Ensure that diverse housing options are available for Howard County residents to age in the community and to function as independently as possible.
 - Create momentum for building or retrofitting needed housing options (focus groups with homeowners & contractors to better understand market; loan guarantees, tax credits.
 - Increase the number of contractors skilled at retrofitting homes consistent with aging in place and universal design principles.
 - Encourage innovative design and technology that supports aging in place, including new models with support services.



- Priority #2: Provide affordable, accessible, reliable, safe, convenient, cost-effective mobility options to get people where they want and need to go, when they want to go.
 - Improve senior access to bus routes, including improvements to bus stops, better marketing of bus services (such as schedules in multiple languages), and travel training.
 - Increase the efficiency of paratransit services, including improvements to dispatching software, grouping of trips to medical facilities, and use of taxi vouchers.
 - Increase the supply of driver support programs and volunteer transportation programs.



- Priority #3: Optimize opportunities for a healthy quality of life for all residents that integrate physical, behavioral and spiritual well-being, in a manner that supports personal choice.
 - Expand behavioral health services for older Howard County residents.
 - Expand current, and identify potential new models, for health and wellness activities targeted toward older adults.
 - Develop a framework for collaboration between hospitals serving Howard County residents, community-based organizations, and long-term care facilities to reduce hospital readmissions by Medicare recipients.



- Priority #4: Promote the physical, emotional and financial well-being of caregivers as well as those for whom they care.
 - Create an expanded, coordinated system of education and support for family and professional caregivers.
 - Develop new models for respite care and expand existing programs such as adult day care, Senior Center Plus and Kindred Spirits.
 - Expand community resources for caregivers, and promote their availability.

- Priority #5: Prepare residents for the implications of the "new demographic reality" at both the personal and community level.
 - Develop a multigenerational model for lifelong learning on issues related to aging.
 - Develop a sustainable strategy to use electronic, print and social media to communicate consistent information to mature adults planning for the future.
 - Develop mechanisms to engage residents in an on-going public dialog regarding issues related to aging and the implications for the community of the growth in number of older adults.



- Priority #6: Provide affordable, accessible, reliable, safe, convenient, cost-effective services and resources for the County's most vulnerable residents.
 - Create a coordinated system of service delivery among those agencies serving vulnerable residents (include the MultiService Center and the Vulnerable Adults Committee).
 - Create a community education campaign to increase understanding of an individual's rights to self-determination & how to put protective measures in place.
 - Coordinate outreach to the most vulnerable, including non-English speakers, and connect them with services and resources.



- Priority #7: Encourage multi-sector collaboration among public, for-profit and non-profit entities.
 - Promote a disciplined approach to building effective collaborations that ensures all the right "eyes" are on the issues.
 - Convene stakeholder groups for each priority area to prioritize next steps for their issue area, identify metrics to measure success, and determine roles each can play to advance the effort.
 - Provide "backbone support" for collaborative efforts to ensure that the work progresses.
