2000 CENSUS Household Type and Relationship Characteristics

Introduction

The Department of Planning and Zoning's first Research Report, Issue 1, provided a summary of the 2000 Census results for Howard County. In that report, various datasets on population, age, race, housing, household type and relationship information were summarized. This current report discusses more detailed results on household type and relationships including state and national comparisons as well as more detailed comparisons between different locations within the County. Comparisons are also made to 1990 populations. Note that this current report covers the household type and relationship characteristics of the entire population. Future reports may include various cross-tabulations such as household type and relationship by age or by race.

Howard County Compared to Maryland and U.S.

Household Type

Howard County has a greater percentage of family households compared to both the U.S. and Maryland – 73.1 percent for Howard County compared to 68.6 and 68.1 percent for Maryland and the U.S, respectively, according to the 2000 Census. This reflects Howard County's status as a "bedroom community," attracting families due to its high quality schools, safe environment and other amenities. A family household is defined as two of more people in the same household related by birth, marriage or adoption.

For the U.S. and Maryland about half of all households consist of married couple family households. By comparison, about 60 percent of all households in Howard County have married couples. The corollary to this is that there are greater percentages of non-family and other family households in Maryland and U.S. compared to Howard County. Other family households primarily consist of single parent households — mostly single mothers and to a lesser degree single fathers.

About 27 percent of all households in Howard County are non-family households, which primarily include householders living alone and unmarried partners. For Maryland, 31.4 percent of all households are non-family households. For the entire U.S. the percentage is 31.9 percent. The tables and charts below summarize these data for both 2000 and 1990. The change from 1990 to 2000 is also shown and discussed further below.







In 1990, the same general pattern as in 2000 was apparent, with Howard County having a greater percentage of family and married couple households compared to Maryland and the U.S. Since 1990, for the County, State and U.S., slight drops have occurred in the percentages of family and married couple households and slight increases have occurred in the percentages of other family and non-family households. The decrease in the percentage of family and married couple households and increase in non-family households in Howard County, was not as extensive,

however. This is an indication that although Howard County has followed the larger national and state trends of increasing household type diversity, it is not as pronounced, and there has been a greater propensity for the County to "hold on" to its status as more of a family oriented bedroom community.

As the above chart shows, more than 50 percent of all new households in the County between 1990 and 2000 were married couples, significantly greater than the percentages for Maryland and the U.S. About 30 percent of the total household growth in Howard County were non-family households compared to about 50 percent for Maryland and 46 percent for the U.S.

Family Households


Looking at family households more closely, of the total 65,790 in Howard County in 2000, 29,226 or about 44 percent are the "traditional" nuclear family defined as a married couple living with one of more of their own children under 18. This represents about one-third of the total 90,043 households in Howard County. In Maryland, the nuclear family percentage is about 34 percent of total families and 23 percent of all households. For the U.S. the percentages are similar at about 35 percent and 24 percent, respectively. This again indicates Howard County's relative status as more of a bedroom community.

The next greatest family category for the U.S., Maryland and Howard County is married couples not living their own children under 18. These include married couples that don't have children and married couples with children over 18. The U.S. has the greatest percent of all family households in this category at 41.3 percent, followed by 39.2 percent for Maryland and 38.3 percent for Howard County.

The other four categories include £male and male householders with no spouse present and living with and without their own children under 18. The largest of these are female householders with no husband present living with their own children under 18. This category ranges from 10.5 percent of all families in the U.S. to 11.7 percent in Maryland to 8.1 percent in Howard County. The percentages for female householders with no husband present without there own children under 18 are lower by comparison. This would include women living with their own children 18 or over or living with another relative such as a brother or sister. Male householders with no wife present represent the smallest family type, ranging from about 2.0 percent in Howard County to 3.2 percent in Maryland. The amount of men in this category living with and without their own children under 18 is more evenly split compared to women. The table and chart below summarize these data.

Non-Family Households

As indicated earlier, about 27 percent of all households in Howard County, slightly more than 24,000, were of non-family households according to the 2000 Census. Of these households in Howard County, the significant majority, about 77 percent, consist of residents living alone. This represents about 1 in every 5 households in the County, about 20 percent. The percentages are higher for the State and the U.S. as a whole – 79.7 and 80.8 percent of non-family households and 25.0 and 25.8 percent of all households, about one in every for, for Maryland and the U.S., respectively. The table below and the chart on the following page summarize this information.



Unmarried Partner Households

The 2000 Census also reported that there were 4,221 unmarried partner households in Howard County, 4.7 percent of total households. Slightly higher percentages occur for the State and U.S. These include same sex and opposite sex close personal relationships. The data are summarized in the table below.

Intra-State Comparisons – Year 2000

The tables, charts and maps on the following pages compare household type and relationship characteristics for Maryland jurisdictions, including all counties and Baltimore City, for the year 2000. Compared to most other jurisdictions in Maryland, Howard County has greater percentages of family households, family households with children under 18, and the traditional nuclear family households (married couple with own children under 18).

In particular, Howard ranks 3rd in the State behind Calvert and Charles counties for the percentage of family households with children under 18 and also ranks third behind Calvert and Carroll counties for the percentage of nuclear family households. Howard ranks 9^{th} (out of 24 jurisdictions) for the percentage of family households in general, including those both with and without children.

As would be expected, Howard County ranks further down at 16th in the percentage of non-family households. For the percentage of householders living alone, Howard ranks 17th out of the 24 jurisdictions. For female family headed households with no husband present Howard ranks


even lower at 20th. Again, these statistics indicate Howard County's recognized status as a bedroom community, the same status also shared by other growing and relatively newer suburban jurisdictions in Maryland primarily located in the more central part of the State.


The first table below provides a summary of the percentages for various household and family categories for all the jurisdictions listed in alphabetical order. Total households are also provided to indicate the relative size of each jurisdiction. Note that Howard County ranks 19th in the total number of households (90,043) out of the 24 jurisdictions. However, the next most populous county, Anne Arundel, has about twice the number of households as Howard. In fact, the five most population jurisdictions – Anne Arundel, Baltimore City, Prince Georges, Baltimore and Montgomery Counties – contain close to 70 percent the total households in the State. This should be kept in mind when looking at the percentages, as the same percentage for a more populous jurisdiction yields greater numbers of households for a particular category.


The charts on the following pages rank the jurisdictions for five of the household and family categories better showing the relative differences. The associated thematic map on each page helps to show geographic concentrations and comparisons. The data in the maps are shown in equal ranges with the darker the shade representing the greater the percentage.




























Comparisons Within Howard County – Year 2000

The series of tables below indicate household type within Howard County, showing the results by smaller Regional Planning District (RPD). The first table shows the absolute numbers and the next two tables show the percentage breakdowns.

The percentages in red are those percentages that are less than the total percentage for the associated category. For example, as shown in the second table, 37.3 percent of all family households in Howard County are located in Columbia. This is *less than* the 40.3 percent of all County households that are located in Columbia. On the other hand, 48.4 percent of all non-family households in the County are located in Columbia, a *greater percentage* than the 40.3 percent of total County households located in Columbia. These variations, although minor in some cases, do show the relative concentrations of household types in the County between regions.

Howard County Household Type by Regional Planning District - 2000






Generally, the differences between percentages are small, but patterns do become apparent in the tables. For example, concentrations of red in Ellicott City, West Friendship, Cooksville and Clarksville show that there is less of a propensity for there to be other family (non-married) and non-family households compared to the other areas. Concentrations of red in Columbia, Laurel and Elkridge, on the other hand, indicate that there is less of a propensity for there to be family and married couple family households.


The chart below graphically illustrates these results by RPD. The thematic maps beginning on the next page show variations by census tract which depict even smaller areas within each RPD. The following summarize some of the major findings:


- Clarksville has the greatest percentages of both family and married couple family households, 88.8 percent and 81.8 percent of total households there, respectively. West Friendship and Cooksville also have high percentages, at only one to two percentage points lower.
- Laurel has the greatest percentage of other family households with 15.7 percent, followed closely by Columbia with 14.4 percent and Elkridge at 13.0 percent. As subsets of this, Laurel also has the greatest percentages of both male and female single parent households. Most of these households in both Laurel and Elkridge are concentrated east of I-95. In Columbia, they tend to be concentrated in the older Villages.
- Columbia has the greatest percentage of non-family households with 32.3 percent. This is closely followed by Elkridge with 28.8 percent and Laurel with 28.5 percent. There are also concentrations of non-family households in parts of Ellicott City. Most of these non-family households consist of householders living alone.

















Family Households

The tables below summarize a further breakdown of family households by specific family household type in Howard County, including those with and without children under 18. The maps on the subsequent pages summarize the data at the census tract level.

For the family household category, Elkridge has the greatest percentage of nuclear families, defined as married couples living with their own children under 18, at close to 50 percent. At the smaller area level, however, as is apparent in Map 12, the River Hill area of Columbia has an even greater percentage. West Friendship has the greatest percentage of married couples with no children under 18 (47.1 percent of total family households). Columbia has the greatest percentage of single mothers both living with their own children under 18 and living with no children under 18 (10.8 percent and 6.0 percent of total family households, respectively). Laurel has the greatest percentage of single fathers, although the percentages are relatively low at under 4 percent for each category.

Non-family Households

The tables and chart below summarize the non-family households by Regional Planning District. As indicated previously, there were 24,253 non-family households in Howard County in 2000. Most of these, 18,767, consist of householders living alone. Columbia has the greatest percentage of householders living alone at over 25 percent of total households. This is followed by Elkridge with 21.5 percent, Laurel with 20.4 percent and Ellicott City with 19.1 percent. West Friendship, Cooksville and Clarksville have relatively less residents living alone with only 10.2, 9.6 and 8.6 percent of total households in each region, respectively. Note that the first set of tables and chart represent *total non-family* households, whereas the second set of tables and chart include *total* households.





Unmarried Partner Households
