PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION BOARD MINUTES

May 24, 2016 at 7:00 p.m.

1. Approval of the April 26, 2016, Minutes

The Minutes were approved by a vote of 6-0. Ms. Giles abstained from the vote.

2. Announcements

• Mr. Graham advised the Office of Transportation would be holding a public hearing on June 16, 2016 at the Regional Transportation Agency (RTA) office regarding Policy on Fare or Service change. The required public notice for the hearing had been put on the RTA website, notices on buses and in local newspapers in each of the partner's jurisdictional areas; within the service area of the RTA. The Howard County Council had been informed, as required by the County Administration Procedures Act regarding any procedural change in Policy.

The policy sets forth the decision making process, including public input requirements, for approving fare or major service change in the RTA service area. Upon this policy being approved, the County Executive of Howard County would make a final decision on major route or fare changes. Before making a decision, the Executive would have to consider recommendations from the partner jurisdictions and the public.

- Columbia Maryland was awarded a Bronze Award by the League of American Bicyclists for being the third most bicycle friendly community in the United States.
- The Office of Transportation hosted the 19th Annual Bike to Work Day on May 20, 2016. It was a very successful event in which over 300 bicyclists were enrolled in the annual event.

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3. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

4. Old Business

Regional Transportation Agency Bus Replacement (Update)

Mr. Graham advised the current FY17 budget includes funding to replace 11 Howard County buses by using a lease option for the purchase. The County Council would be voting on May 26, 2016 and it is expected the budget will be passed.

The MTA has applied for FTA funding for bus fleet replacement that has become available. The MTA has applied on behalf of the Local Operated Transit Systems (LOTS) in the state, including the RTA.

Role of the Public Transportation Board- bike/ped committee

Mr. Schoen recommended that the Public Transportation Board (PTB) widen its scope to also serve as the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board, a new body recommended in BikeHoward, the Bicycle Master Plan. Mr. Graham advised that currently, there has been no movement in the Administration to create such an advisory board. He suggested that the PTB might send a letter to the Administration if they wished to widen the scope of the PTB's charter. Mr. Hartman requested that the OoT draft such a letter with this recommendation to widen the scope of the PTB.

Transit Development Plan – TDP (Update)

Mr. Graham advised that the Office of Transportation (OoT), Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), and KFH Group (KFH) along with area partners are currently scoping out the TDP. KFH is currently fleshing out a scope which will include reviewing Howard County transit as they have not been reviewed for several years.

The scope may include some key questions: 1) what are the priorities for service? (serving low-income populations?) 2) How constrained are future operating budgets? (can we use the planning process to explore a larger system with shorter headways?)

Mr. Garcia suggested in addition to route changes, to also include a higher quality of service that will provide and communicate to a diverse population here in Howard County.

PTB members will be updated as the TDP project proceeds and Clive welcomed the board's input. He suggested devoting the next PTB meeting to a broader policy discussion on the TDP.

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Regional Transportation Agency Commission

Mr. Graham advised the draft of the bylaws and the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the RTA Commission has been completed. They are currently being reviewed by Anne Arundel County and he believed that both Howard and Anne Arundel Counties are in agreement. After this review the MOU and by-laws will be forwarded to Prince George's County and the City of Laurel for review. Once all partners are in agreement and have signed, the RTA Commission can be seated.

Maryland Department of Transportation Priority Letter (Update)

Mr. Graham notified the PTB board that this year's priority letter had been signed by the County Executive and by the chairs of the County Council and state delegation, and had been forwarded to the Office of the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT). The letter includes a summary of transportation projects and funding which Howard County would like to see in the upcoming Fiscal Year 2017. PTB board members were furnished a copy of the priority letter.

5. New Business

Development Review

Kathleen Donodeo (OoT) gave a presentation on the Office of Transportation's (OoT) role in the Development Review process.

Mr. Hartman stated the main concern of the Board is to ensure the OoT has a role in the processing and approval of any new developments in the County. Ms. Donodeo stated she is now optimistic that the OoT is being involved at the beginning stages of all projects so the OoT can provide input on development design. This would include roadway, bikeways, sidewalks, and ADA conformity of new development.

Ms. Donodeo advised that new developments are often not being built in locations that are logical in a transportation point of view. She stated that private developers purchase the locations for new development and then the Planning & Zoning/ Public Works departments review the plans for compliance with the Howard County Design Manual requirements. Ms. Donodeo presented the current DPZ workflow chart and gave examples of past developments where OoT input recommended sidewalks to a plan, and whether that input was taken or not.. OoT now reviews new plans and signs off with comments to the given department prior to the project moving forward. Ms. Donodeo would also like for the OoT to have the opportunity to have input on future county building development locations such as a new Senior Center. New locations of buildings can have dramatic impacts on the ability of County residents to access these services using existing fixed bus routes. Finally, she distributed a current draft site plan and discussed the issues and tradeoffs related to transit and pedestrian access at the site.

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Mr. Schoen suggested that the current Subdivision and Regulations be revised to more fully include bicycle and pedestrian needs. These revisions would follow the "Complete Streets Policy" in the Howard County Master Bicycle Plan. Clive said that a Complete Streets workgroup had started to meet and could present to the PTB when it was further along.

Upcoming June meeting

The board discussed agenda topics for the upcoming PTB meetings. Mr. Graham suggested the June meeting might cover policy aspects of the Transit Development Plan. Mr. Hartman concurred.

6. Adjournment

Mr. Hartman adjourned the meeting at 8:45 pm. The next Public Transportation Board meeting is scheduled for **June 28, 2016 at 7:00 pm.**
