I. <u>POLICY</u>

It is the policy of the Howard County Sheriff's Office to establish certain terms and verbiage to facilitate crystalline communication between its members in both written and oral communications.

II. ORGANIZATIONAL DEFINITIONS

- A. <u>HCSO</u>: The Howard County Sheriff's Office
- B. <u>Division</u>: The primary subdivision of the Office of the Sheriff.
- C. <u>Section</u>: The primary subdivision of a Division.
- D. <u>Unit</u>: The primary subdivision of a Section composed of a group of deputies performing related tasks and often operating in unison.
- E. <u>Detail</u>: A subdivision of a Division, Section, or Squad where the members are assigned to a specialized task.
- F. <u>Sector</u>: A geographical subdivision of Howard County to which one or more deputies are assigned.
- G. <u>Supervisory Area</u>: A geographical subdivision of Howard County comprised of one or more sectors.
- H. <u>Shift</u>: A scheduled period of time during which a group of members are assigned to work.
- I. <u>Headquarters</u>: The facility that houses the Sheriff and his staff.

III. PERSONNEL DEFINITIONS

- A. <u>Personnel</u>: All persons on the HCSO payroll.
- B. <u>Members</u>: All personnel who are sworn deputy sheriffs.
- C. <u>Employees</u>: All personnel other than sworn deputy sheriffs.
- D. <u>Rank</u>: Official grade or position, on a scale classifying personnel.
- E. <u>Precedence of Rank</u>: The following is the precedence of rank, in descending order:

- 1. Sheriff
- 2. Chief Deputy (Major)
- 3. Lieutenant
- 4. Sergeant
- 5. Corporal
- 6. Deputy
- F. <u>Seniority</u>: Among members of the same rank, precedence is based upon length of service at that rank.
- G. <u>Supervisor</u>: Any personnel having permanent supervisory responsibility for other members or employees, or any member holding the rank of Corporal or higher.
- H. <u>Commissioned Officer</u>: A member holding the rank of Lieutenant or higher.
- I. <u>Non-Commissioned Officer</u>: A member holding the rank of Corporal or Sergeant.
- J. <u>Shift Supervisor</u>: A member who has supervisory responsibility for a shift.
- K. <u>Deputy in Charge (Duty Officer)</u>: A member below the rank of Corporal who has temporary supervisory responsibility for a detail, geographic point, crime scene, or Operations Division.

IV. OTHER TERMINOLOGY

- A. <u>Chain of Command</u>: The line of authority which extends from the Sheriff through a single person at each level of supervision to the level of execution.
- B. <u>On Duty</u>: The period of time during which members are actively engaged in the performance of HCSO duties.
- C. <u>Off Duty</u>: Any period of time during which members are not on duty.
- D. <u>Tour of Duty</u>: The hours in which an employee or member is scheduled or required to work.
- E. <u>Shall/Will</u>: Indicates, in orders or directives, that the action is mandatory.
- F. <u>Should</u>: Indicates, in orders or directives, that the action is advisable.
- G. <u>May</u>: Indicates, in orders or directives, that the action is permissible.
- H. <u>Lawful Order</u>: Any order, verbal or written, issued by a Supervisor, which is not in violation of any law, ordinance, or HCSO policy.
- I. <u>Line Authority</u>: Direct operating authority delegated by the Sheriff through each level of supervision until the level of execution is reached. Line authority determines the need, time, and place for action.
- J. <u>Staff Authority</u>: Derives from assignment within the HCSO rather than from rank, and includes only authority over personnel performing functions related to that assignment.
- K. <u>Through Official Channels</u>: Through the hands of a single supervisor in each level of the Chain of Command.
- L. <u>Tense of Words</u>: In written orders and directives, words used in the present tense also imply the future tense.
- M. <u>Plurality of Words</u>: In written orders and directives, the use of the plural includes the singular and the use of the singular implies the plural.

V. <u>CANCELLATION</u>

This General Order cancels and replaces General Order ADM-02, <u>Definitions & Terminology</u>, dated December 1, 2003.
