- 8 **[(g)] (H)** Nonpublic schools may participate under any contracts for goods or 9 commodities that are awarded by county boards, other public agencies, or 10 intergovernmental purchasing organizations, if the lead agency for the contract award 11 follows public bidding procedures.
- [(h)] (I) A contract entered into or purchase made in violation of this section is void.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
