PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION BOARD MINUTES May 23, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

1. Approval of the April 25, 2017 Minutes

The Minutes were approved by a vote of 5-0.

2. Announcements

Clive announced that there is intent to make future route changes on two of the Regional Transportation Agency's current routes. One of the routes is in Anne Arundel County while the second is in Howard County. The current plan is to have the RTA post and advertise the intended changes during the month of June so comments may be received at a July public hearing. The current policy requires the Public Transportation Board (PTB) to hold the public hearing in event the RTA Commission is not seated. If the RTA Commission has not been seated, the PTB board would include the hearing as part of its July 25, 2017 meeting. It was suggested the PTB meeting be held at the RTA office due to its proximity to Anne Arundel County.

3. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

4. Old Business

Role of the Public Transportation Board- bike/ped committee

Clive advised that the PTB legislation (CB 20-2017) was introduced to the County Council but is currently tabled for second time. He advised it is scheduled on the agenda of the next council work session in June. There is a concern of Councilperson Jen Teresa that the PTB not lose its major focus on transit.

Regional Transportation Agency Commission (Update)

Clive advised that the RTA Commission is still not seated at this time, but expressed a hope that a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be signed before the end of this fiscal year allowing it to sit. If an agreement of the partners cannot be concluded, Clive suggested that maybe another model will have to be considered.

Regional Transportation Agency (Update)

Mark Pritchard presented an overview "snapshot" of the April performance of the Regional Transportation Agency (RTA). Highlights included:

- Fixed route ridership for the month did not met goals (passengers per hour)
- Paratransit service had an increase in demand and ridership
- 333 missed trips a very bad number. Mark noted mechanical issues and age of the fleet as factors
- 12 new paratransit vehicles are expected in July that may be used on fixed routes in the short term

Ron Hartman suggested that some of the data on the snapshot may not be accurate, for example, higher mileage of April trips at the same time as a high spike in missed trips. Mark said he would review the data with his staff.

Priority Letter (Update)

Clive said the Priority Letter had been completed and signed by County Executive Kittleman, Senator Guzzone, Delegate Atterbeary and Council Chairman Jon Weinstein. The letter has been forwarded to the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT).

Bus Stop Changes; Public Input

Clive summarized last month's PTB meeting by stating that the PTB members agreed that there should be a process in place for public notification regarding bus stop. The process should give riders advanced written notice of the anticipated changes and the opportunity to either attend the next monthly PTB meeting, or send their comments for board consideration.

5. New Business

Pedestrian Master Plan Presentation

Chris Eatough and Albert Engel of the Office of Transportation presented an overview of the draft Pedestrian Master Plan. The presentation gave an overview and summary as follows:

- The present state of walkability in Howard County, and the walkability vision articulated in the plan
- What improvements the County has completed under the 2007 Pedestrian Master Plan, which identified numerous intersection and sidewalk improvements, and how the new plan differed from it.
- A description of the field assessment completed for the new plan: County staff assessed 343 miles of sidewalks, 915 intersections, and 494 bus stops for ADA compliance.
- An explanation of the public input process for this plan: open houses and an online Wikimap allowed the public to identify locations of concern
- An account of how the Pedestrian Advisory Team developed the plan's Vision, Goals, and Guiding Principles.
- An overview of the needs the plan identifies for sidewalk installation and repair, ADA upgrading and maintenance, and intersection improvements
- A map showing structured pedestrian projects, which recommend possible combinations of individual improvements in the same geographic area, that are identified in the plan.
- Cost estimates for structured projects totalling to \$11.73M: \$9.56M in sidewalk construction, \$1.28M in intersection improvements and \$890,000 in bus stop improvements.

6. Adjournment

Mr. Hartman adjourned the meeting at 8:21 pm. The next Public Transportation Board meeting is scheduled for **June 27, 2017 at 7:00 pm.**

Proposed Service Enhancements to Existing Routes


Route 405/Yellow will adjust slightly creating a loop of service via Town and Country Boulevard at North Ridge Road. This enhancement will provide a direct connection to the Walmart on North Ridge Road. All existing bus stops will continue to be served.

Southbound Route 409/Purple leaving Elkridge Corners will now turn right onto Greenfield Road providing new access to apartment complexes. The route will continue left onto Rowanberry Drive to Route 1 south stopping at points on Greenfield Road and Rowanberry Drive, including the Elkridge Library and Parkview Apartments. Two shelters will be added along Rowanberry Drive for patrons of the library and residents of Parkview Apartments.




Proposed Service Enhancements to Existing Routes

Route 503/E service will be re-routed between the intersection of Guilford Road/Gerwig Lane and Patuxent Woods Drive. The proposed route will travel between Guilford and Snowden River Parkway, thereby providing service to the Howard County Food Bank. Stops on Guilford Road no longer served by Route 503/E will continue to be served by Route 407.



Proposed Service Enhancements to Existing Routes

Route 501/Silver would run between Columbia Mall and Arundel Mills Mall only. Alternative for the current service from Arundel Mills Mall to Baltimore Washington Airport (BWI) would be MTA Route 75-Baltimore Link.



Route 401/Green current stop at Hickory Ridge Place will be relocated to Sunny Spring.


Route 404/Orange will continue to serve the front door of Hickory Ridge Place.



Route 405/Yellow will remain on Route 40 and bus stops on North Chatham Road will be relocated to Route 40 west of North Chatham Road.




Route 405/Yellow will serve the Walmart at Ellicott City at a relocated bus stop. Bus stop will be moved to the western end of the parking lot near the Garden Center, in order to provide for better pedestrian safety and bus operations. A shelter will be provided at this location.




Routes 406/Red and 408/Gold remain on Foreland Garth and stop at the existing bus shelter at Shalom Square. Routes will not pull into Longwood parking lot.

Routes 406/Red and 408/Gold will remain on Tamar Drive at the Long Ranch Village Center. The existing bus stops in Long Reach Village Center will be discontinued due to upcoming redevelopment. Buses will stop on Tamar Drive east of Cloudleap Court.



The Columbia Medical Center stops currently served by **Route 407/Brown** will now be served only by **Route 408/Gold**.

COMING THIS JULY! HOWARD COUNTY ELECTRIC BUSES

Through a Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Transit Investments for Greenhouse Gas and Energy Reduction (TIGGER) program grant, Howard County, RTA, the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), and the Center for Transportation and the Environment (CTE) have partnered to replace three aging diesel buses with three state-of-the-art battery electric buses that will charge wirelessly at the Columbia Mall while in service.

Manufactured by BYD in Lancaster, CA, the electric buses utilize Momentum Dynamics inductive ("wireless") on-route charging. The buses will operate on the RTA (Route 401/Green) servicing Columbia Mall, Wilde Lake Village, Howard County Community College, and Howard County General Hospital. Data loggers on board each bus will provide information as to the efficiency and cost effectiveness of inductive charging for electric bus fleets. The data will also be used to calculate estimated emission reductions as a result of operating the battery electric buses in place of diesel buses.
