MAY ISSUE A CIVIL CITATION AS PROVIDED IN § 10–119 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW

- 1 (2) In Anne Arundel County, Frederick County, Harford County, **HOWARD**2 **COUNTY,** Kent County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Talbot County,
 3 the inspector shall successfully complete an appropriate program of training in the proper
 4 use of arrest authority and pertinent police procedures as required by the board of license
 5 commissioners.
- 6 (3) In Anne Arundel County, Harford County, **HOWARD COUNTY,** Kent 7 County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Talbot County, the inspector 8 may not carry a firearm in the performance of the inspector's duties.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2020.
