Summary of Solar Incentives – Federal, State, and Local

Federal Incentives

- Federal Investment Tax Credit (ITC)
 - o **2016 2019:** The tax credit remains at **30 percent** of the cost of the system.
 - 2020: Owners of new residential and commercial solar can deduct 26 percent of the cost of the system from their taxes.
 - 2021: Owners of new residential and commercial solar can deduct 22 percent of the cost of the system from their taxes.
 - 2022 onwards: Owners of new commercial solar energy systems can deduct 10
 percent of the cost of the system from their taxes. There is no federal credit for
 residential solar energy systems.
